<p>Zanita Louise Davies Community Outstanding Achievement Award</p>	<p>For dedication, since the 1980s, to the promotion of the history of Magnetic Island. Through her involvement with the Magnetic Island History and Craft Centre, Zanita Davies in her role as President has led a progressive development of documentation, ensuring best small museum practice. Since 2001 she has been the driving force behind the Centre’s annual exhibition, undertaking research, compiling, curating and publicising. She has provided information for 20 heritage signs now located on the island. By securing the necessary funding, she has saved two 1920s huts, removed to the museum site. In 2013 she was instrumental in the organisation of the Picnic Bay School Centenary. Since October 1996, Zanita Davies has secured grants valued at over \$88,000 for the Centre. Her work has shown a very strong commitment to her local community, generating wide interest in local history.</p>
<p>Great Houses of Ipswich National Trust Outstanding Achievement Award</p>	<p>This project has seen 3 private homes open for each open day, showcasing the wonderful heritage homes of Ipswich. With the 5th edition of this event coming very soon on 12 September, visitation has grown from under 1,000 the first time to about 2,500 in May earlier this year. This project raises awareness of the historic homes in this area and inspires other owners to care for their important houses as well. Thank you again to Ipswich City Council for their partnership. <p>Richard Stringer Community Lifetime Achievement Award</p>	<p>Richard has made an extremely significant contribution to heritage conservation through his photographic work in Queensland over five decades. As an architect and photographer, he has been recording Queensland buildings and landscapes with professional integrity, and a preference for black and white, since 1965. His work has featured nationally in library and gallery collections, major exhibitions, and a large number of books on architecture, sculpture, paintings and gardens. He also has made a significant contribution to establishing architectural and art photographic records. Richard’s photographs are not only visually appealing, they help people see and respect the landscape of cultural heritage that is or was around them. The National Trust is indebted to him for his contribution to our endeavours, as are many others. In 2000, the National Trust toured an exhibition of his important photographs through regional Queensland.</p>
<p>Dorothy Gibson-Wilde OAM and Bruce Gibson-Wilde National Trust Lifetime Achievement Award</p>	<p>Dorothy and Bruce have been working tirelessly on the establishment and management of the Townsville Heritage Centre since the 1970s. As volunteers they spend many hours every week taking tours, facilitating events and caring for the Centre. In addition, Historian Dr Dorothy Gibson-Wilde OAM probably knows more about the history of Northern Queensland than anyone else and she has been instrumental in identifying and protecting many significant places in the north.</p>
