A LIVING HISTORY OF THE SNOWY MOUNTAINS

Following the success of his first course in Autumn 1989, Dean Turner, (a member of the Kosciusko Huts Association) is to run another course on the history of the Snowy Mountains over four days in Spring from 26-29 October 1990. Dean's course is one of a number of specialised courses co-ordinated by the Centre for Continuing Education at the Australian National University.

The mountain course will examine the six human invasions of Australia's High Country by taking participants on day walks to explore aboriginal sites, mountain huts, ruins and other sites of significance. Participants will unravel the diverse social and cultural heritage of the Snowy Mountains over the course of each day as they meet and receive help from a number of colourful characters, bushmen and local experts. In this way, by looking through the eyes of the people involved, the course will focus uniquely on LIVING history.

Participants will meet an expert on aboriginal culture, a veteran of the Snowy Mountain Scheme, a local historian from the Adaminaby district, an alpine sawmiller, park rangers, and a stockman whos father before him managed the snowlease on the very top of Mt Kosciusko. These interviews and guided walks will be supplemented with evening bursts of bush poetry and the odd historic film.

The course will include two introductory lectures in Canberra to be held on the evenings of 18 and 25 October 1990 at the Centre for Continuing Education (course notes will be available for those unable to attend).

The cost of the course will be approximately \$250 including twinshare accommodation and fully catered meals (any profits made will be directed to the restoration and maintenance of huts in the National Park). Transport will be organised by car pooling. Enrolments will begin on 4 August through the Centre for Continuing Education. However, earlier expressions of interest are welcome. 

VISIT TO PRIME MINISTERS LODGE AND GOVERNMENT HOUSE


The annual visit arranged by the Australiana Fund to the Lodge and Government House Yarralumla will take place on Sunday 23 September 1990.

PEN PORTRAITS
Patricia Clarke
\$18.00

If the portraits of women illustrating this book were taken away from the text it would be hard to tell what the sitters had in common except that their dress would place them in the nineteenth century. Some look flighty, some most sober, some fervent, some contented, some formidable, some extremely delicate. What in fact they shared was success in getting their writing about Australia published either in newspapers, periodicals, or serials as novels, childrens stories, political pamphlets or illustrated reference books.

"Pen Portraits" is a book to whet the appetite. The outline life stories of these hundred or so women are so varied and interesting one would like to know more. Patricia Clarke passes no judgement on the literary merit of their writing but merely describes their success or lack of it in their lifetimes and since, in Australia and internationally. Armed with this book, the notes and excellent bibliography we can set off in search them and even if we discover no towering geniuses the canvas of nineteenth century Australia will be richly painted. I plan to start with Caroline Dexter "a most unusual women who published Australia's first 'Ladies Almanack'.... she also practiced in Melbourne as a herbal physician, mesmerist and clairvoyant, and with Harriet Clisby began a very earnest 'blue stocking' style monthly magazine, the Interpreter in 1861". "The Woman's Voice" although it only lasted for eighteen months will make intriguing reading with it's aim to be "womanly, but not weak; democratic but not revolutionary; fearless without effrontery; liberal without license". The April issue of 1895 included a full page article on "Cycling for Women" and it's liberating influence. The illustration of Mrs Maddock, captain of the Sydney Ladies Bicycle Club who had ridden an upright bicycle from Sydney to Melbourne may banish twentieth century feelings of superiority. It will be interesting too to get hold of a copy of Catherine Martin's "An Australian Girl" which was out of print for many years but is now regarded highly. The seventh child of a very poor Scottish crofter, Catherine had tried to make a living as a journalist in Adelaide in the 1870's. "An Australian Girl" her first published novel, was printed anonymously in London in 1890. Was it a trying bluestocking romance or a work of genius? "Pen Portraits" has opened a lot of doors just a little way.

OUR FAMILY TREE ALBUM Published by Memory Press \$15.00

"Has your family ever kept a central record of facts and photographs, or do you have to keep asking who your ancestors were and where they came from? Keeping an official record can not only be fun it can be doing the rest of the family a service". So reads the introduction to this delightful Edwardian style scrapbook which has lots of encouraging headings and blank spaces to keep the budding historian and archivist sleuthing away. If the going get's tough the addresses of the Society of Genealogists, the Heraldry Society, the Genealogy Bookshop and the Brittish Association for Local History are all given. For a child who loves "filling in" the section at the end of the album for Family Vehicles, Family Holidays, Family Collections and Special Occassions will be easy and fun. Grand-parents will be at a premium for help with the "ancestor" sections finding photographs of, for example, "husbands's paternal Great-Grandparents. In fact this album would make a perfect present for the child who likes to ask questions and has a grandparent who likes to answer them.

GIPPSLAND ODYSSEY

FRIDAY 28 SEPTEMBER TO MONDAY 1 OCTOBER (LABOUR DAY) 1990.

For those who like to explore new areas, who don't get put off by gravel roads and who nonetheless like a good meal and comfortable bed at night, Garth Setchell is offering to lead a guided tour to a number of delightful areas in East Gippsland.

The itinerary will depend to some extent on the weather but is likely to include such interesting places as Rocky Hall and the Towamba Valley, Green Cape, Jenoa Peak, Wingan Inlet, Combienbar, Cape Conran, the mouth of the Snowy River, Bucham Caves, Mackillop's Bridge across the lower Snowy gorge and a taste of the Errinundra Plateau.

Although the total driving distance is about 1200km, there will be time for short walks to a wide range of different environments - rocky coastlines, water falls, lookouts, sandy beaches, estuaries, old mining sites, rainforests and wild rivers. There will also be time to inspect the Buchan Caves.

Whilst all roads are trafficable to conventional vehicles, good driving skills are essential. Approximately 450km will be on gravel roads and, although of reasonable surface, much of it is narrow and winding.

Numbers are strictly limited for reasons of comfort and due to the fact that accommodation is scarce. Motel accommodation for up to seven couples, families or groups of three to four has been tentatively reserved for each night but confirmation is required by 17 August 1990. It may also be possible to include a few people who would prefer to camp.

IF YOU WISH TO COME, PLEASE RING THE TRUST OFFICE IMMEDIATELY, GIVING YOUR NAME, ADDRESS, WORK AND HOME TELEPHONE NUMBERS AND THE NAMES OF OTHERS INCLUDED IN YOUR BOOKING (rooms contain a double bed plus one or two singles. Single applicants can only be accepted if prepared to share). IF YOU INTEND TO CAMP, PLEASE MAKE THIS CLEAR.

If the Trust is able to include you, there will be a charge of \$50.00 per head to cover Trust expenses, etc. This, plus a further \$50.00 per head accommodation deposit (for those seeking Motel accommodation) will need to be paid before 31 August 1990).

All other costs will need to be met by participants as incurred. As accomodation costs will depend on the room requirements, it is only possible to offer an approximate guide:

Accomodation: \$100.00 per double (on top of \$50.00 deposit).

Accompanying singles - \$20.00 extra/person.

Meals : \$100.00 per person plus drinks.

Provide own lunches, morning and afternoon teas.

Incidentals : As required.
