# NATIONAL TRUST (ACT) ACTION BUS

The National Trust of Australia (ACT) commissioned Mr Russell Kelly to paint an ACTION bus to highlight the role of the Trust in and around Canberra.

One side of the bus depicts the Sydney/Melbourne Buildings in Civic whilst the other side represents the National Heritage aspect of the National Trust. It features a canoe tree, an Aboriginal painted rock and the Royal Bluebell floral emblem of the ACT. An Art Deco window of the Federation Style architecture of the Albert Hall is superimposed on the front of the bus. The bus also carries the Trust logo and a slogan saying: CARE FOR YOUR HERITAGE JOIN THE NATIONAL TRUST.

It cost \$5,000 for the art work which will be in place for five years. The bus was successfully launched by Senator Margaret Reid outside the Canberra Centre on Thursday 20 September 1990. And the bus will run on the City/Belconnen routes.

BOOK REVIEWS by a "Book Worm". (The books are available from the Trust Gift Shops.)

THE LIFE AND TIMES OF WILLIAM HAY of Boomanoomana 1816-1908 David Hay \$26.00

William Hay was no Apollo and the well-whiskered, healthy middle-aged face which gazes out of the ornate Victorian gilt frame on the dust jacket of his biography supports this. One might be discouraged from reading it but this would be a mistake. The book is interesting on many counts. It describes how a penniless and unconnected young man of twenty-three, who had to leave his home town in Scotland, under a bit of a cloud in 1839, carved out a living for himself in Australia. Writing to a Scotish nephew in 1894 William described his and his wife Jane's life together with typical candour "little gear but plenty of brains, early struggles, competence first, affluence at last" and four years later he was writing again "I have no monetary worries. I neither care to make more nor do I fear to loose it". He never denied that he was self-made, though admitting that his wife's capital gave him a very good start, but he was able to enjoy a success and position he would have been most unlikely to have achieved in Scotland. Much of his life he weighed 18 stone and you can feel this weight on every page of the book as he builds up his pastoral empire round the homestead of Boomanoomana in the Riverina. And, as Member for the Murray in the New South Wales of Assembly between 1872 and 1883, he fights for the interests of all his constituents, humble selectors and large landowners alike. Sadly, his wife remains a shadowy figure. She made several trips back to Scotland on her own so was obviously a woman of parts. She seems to have been instrumental in persuading her husband to leave Boomanoomana in its heyday and build a comfortable mansion in Melbourne for their retirement. He honoured her and described theirs as "a love match on both sides" but unfortunately her thoughts and feelings about life in the Riverina are not known.

After a distinguished life in the Commonwealth Public Service, the author of this satisfying biography, Sir David Hay, Williams' great-grandson, was able to get the homestead back in the family. Together with Lady Hay, who was President of the A.C.T. Branch of the National Trust between 1980 and 1983, he was able to bring the house, outbuildings, garden and 320 acres of farmland back into working order. What a satisfactory tribute to a most respected farmer who gave his "all" to the land of his adoption.

## LAKE BURRINJUCK AND CAREY'S CAVE

SATURDAY 10 NOVEMBER 1990.

It will be necessary to drive to and from Burrinjuck State Recreation Area (about 115km from Canberra via Yass on all-sealed road) but the rest of the day will transport you to other worlds.

Construction of Burrinjuck Dam began in 1907, at which time it was the first significant inland water storage in Australia. The lake should be full in November and our day will start with a cruise to Carey's Cave near Wee Jasper. After a short, level walk from the boat, we will be taken on a guided tour through Carey's Cave. The return cruise will take us back along the lovely Goodradigbee Arm to the dam wall. Our boat, the "Lady BJ" is licensed to carry 49 passengers and is comfortable and well equipped. There are both inboard and outdoor areas.

The ticket price includes all cruise and cave inspection costs plus afternoon tea at "Cooma Cottage", Yass. Participants may bring their own picnic lunch and drinks for consumption on the return cruise, or a selection of fresh sandwiches and fruit can be supplied for \$6.00 per person if ordered at the time of booking. Tea and coffee will be supplied throughout the cruise.
