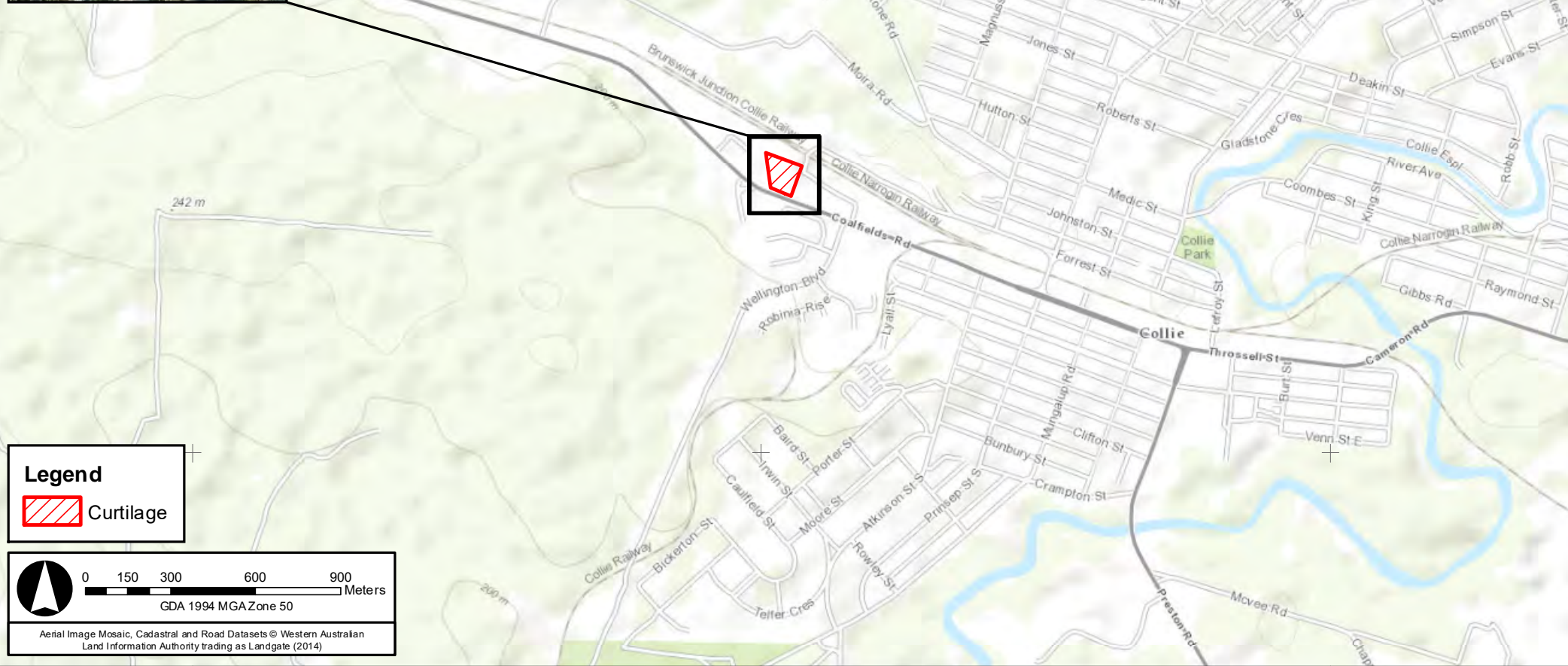

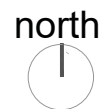

APPENDIX E

ADAPTIVE REUSE PRECEDENT STUDY PANELS

Midland Railway Workshops Midland WA

The Midland Workshops are a large cluster of late 19th century buildings that provide a range of residential, commercial, health, education, entertainment and creative industry uses.



Midland Railway Square Midland WA

Railway Square is an open public space located at the Midland Railway Workshops. The square is located in the former shunting yards when trains were shunted into and out of the workshops and is recognised as an important twentieth century industrial heritage site of state and national significance.

The square is surrounded by cafes, shops, restaurants and bars. The site celebrates its history through a peace memorial and heritage interpretation, while the large public square provides space for recreation, meetings and events.



Premier Mill Katanning WA

The Premier Mill Hotel is a former flour mill in the wheatbelt town of Katanning which has been reimagined as a 22-room hotel including lobby, common areas, bar and café, retaining, exposing and expressing the industrial texture throughout.



John Street Roundhouse Toronto Canada

Built in the 1930s the John Street Roundhouse housed 32 locomotives that were moved in and out of the structure on a 36m wide rotating turntable.

The roundhouse structure and surrounds have been repurposed to include urban open space, miniature railway attraction, railway museum, brewery, retail, entertainment and hospitality venues housed within the roundhouse.
