

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

UPDATE FOR NATIONAL TRUST OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA EDUCATION PROGRAMS

The National Trust of Western Australia is delighted to welcome you and your students to our historic sites. The health and safety of our visitors, volunteers, consultants and employees remains our priority. Western Australia continues to manage the pandemic in a careful and measured manner enabling the resumption of many activities, including excursions. Further information can found [here](#).

These protocols apply to education programs for Peninsula Farm, East Perth Cemeteries, Woodbridge and No 1 Pump Station and are effective as at 1st February 2021.

Each National Trust site has a COVID-19 Safety Plan which is available upon request. We continue to carefully adhere to all government advice as it is issued.

Sites are closed to the public when we are delivering school programs and are cleaned after each school. Students, staff and parents are asked not to attend if they have been unwell or are experiencing a fever, cough, sore throat and / or shortness of breath, or are awaiting the results of a COVID-19 test.

Any person over the age of 16 years is required to register their contact details at the time of arrival. We recommend downloading and using the SafeWA app. Details can also be recorded on our paper-based register if preferred.

Schools are asked to

- Bring clipboards and pencils for your students
- Provide hand sanitiser for school staff and students
- Consider bringing your own tarpaulin, picnic rug or mat as we are unable to sanitise these adequately
- Remind students of good hygiene practices including
 - maintaining respect for personal space
 - covering coughs and sneezes with their elbow or a tissue and disposing of tissues responsibly
 - washing or sanitising hands regularly
- Schools may choose to prepare a contact list of attending students. This should contain the first and last name of the student and a telephone number of a parent / guardian. This will be added to the manual contact register on arrival. This is entirely at the discretion of your school.
- All staff, parents and guardians attending will be required to register upon arrival.

We will provide anti-bacterial wipes and students may be asked to wipe the activity tables before rotating to the next activity. Activities are conducted outdoors, wherever possible, which facilitates the Department of Health's recommendations with regards to physical distancing as well as maximising students' time outdoors in the fresh air.
