





# HANDY HINTS



1. Use your assets, your school may have a building worth studying in its own grounds.
2. Give the children quiet time to investigate, make notes and do sketches.
3. If possible go into the buildings and view the buildings from a variety of angles.
4. Don't try to go to too many places, two or three is enough.
5. Plan food, drink and toilet stops judiciously. History is not good on an empty stomach!
6. Consider using plastecine to copy architectural features.

- Copy words or signs that interest you

- Note down questions you have
- Compare this building to another one
- Note down how this building is heated or cooled
