STATEMENT BY VICTORIA DAVIDSON RE HERITAGE - TO THE NATIONAL TRUST 8 March 23

- 1. I have a strong commitment to heritage conservation. I am a community Independent candidate for the State seat of Lane Cove, a place that includes Lane Cove National Park, Kelly's Bush and the conservation areas of Hunters Hill.
- 2. In my view, the built, cultural and natural heritage, State and local, should be properly protected and conserved. Many in the community also hold this view.
- 3. As to the National Trust's Policy Platform, as on its website under 'NSW State Election: Make Heritage Matter', I generally support the eight policies as stated, with the following comments:
 - a) A NSW Government should ensure that all developments, small and large, including those involving infrastructure and the State, are subject to proper heritage controls.
 - b) Aboriginal Cultural Heritage needs to be protected given its significance and fragility. The best way, subject to further debate, may be by specific legislation.
 - c) Areas of natural significance, including remnant urban bushland and important trees, need to be valued and protected.
 - d) The Government Architect's Design Guide for Heritage should be respected and used by Government as an aid for heritage conservation.
 - e) Heritage organisations, museums and galleries play an important role in our society and should be consistently supported, including with funding, by the Government.
 - f) The Government should be encouraging adaptive reuse of not only heritage buildings, but generally.
 - g) The Government has not been properly protecting and maintaining its own heritage properties. It should be a leader and set an example for all other sectors.
 - h) Local Government has been starved of funds by Government through rate pegging and cost shifting. This needs to change. Funding from Government should include local heritage advisors.
- 4. If elected I will consult with the National Trust on these and other heritage and environmental issues.
