When submitting your entry, it is important to note that there are two broad entry categories, and each require slightly different submissions for judging.

<p>Submission requirements: For projects that involved construction and conservation, it is important to illustrate to the judges the scope and extent of works carried out.</p> <p>Submissions should be combined into a single PDF document and resolution for a computer screen only is required. Max 10MB file.</p> <p>We recommend submissions include details which may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A written summary of the works undertaken, and those involved in the project• Architectural drawings clearly showing the extent of work undertaken for built projects, which differentiate between new and existing components• Project scope/specification and conservation guidance• Specifications outlining repairs undertaken• Demonstrated ongoing preservation (applicable for Enduring category only)• Clear and engaging photographs (eg before and after)	<p>Submission requirements: For projects that did not involve a construction element, the entry submission should demonstrate the key features of the item or event and its success.</p> <p>Submissions should be combined into a single PDF document and resolution for a computer screen only is required. Max 10MB file.</p> <p>We recommend submissions include details which may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A written summary of the work undertaken, and those involved in the project• The length of an exhibition or event, its budget and visitation numbers• The outcome or result of an advocacy campaign or education project• Reviews of a book or exhibition, or community feedback for an event• Photographs showing the event, exhibition or tour• A link to, or copy of the book or resource (for publications and resources such as a new book, a copy should be submitted)• A link to any video or website• Written and illustrated descriptions of the achievements of an individual in relation to a specific category
